

# Multiple Intelligences: A Winning Teaching Style for Each Child

**Include activities from several of the 8 learning styles as possible. With a little planning, one activity can reach more than one learning style at one time.**

**Bodily-kinesthetic:** students who learn through movements of their body: touching, body language, sports, physical games, drama, dance, using clay, and building projects.

**Naturalist:** students who learn from creation. They enjoy the study of nature: collecting, sorting and observing a variety of objects in nature.

**Logical/mathematical:** students who like numbers and abstract patterns. They like to read, write, tell stories, play word games, use computers, debate, and write in journals.

**Intrapersonal:** students who learn by themselves and are comfortable with self-reflection. It involves knowledge of inner feelings and emotional responses. They enjoy self-paced study, journal keeping, and individual projects.

**Spatial:** students who use art and form mental images and pictures with their mind. They enjoy drawing, building, designing and creating things. They love looking at pictures and playing with machines.

**Linguistic:** students who learn best through words. They love exploring ideas and concepts. They express their thoughts and experiences through words including writing, reading, talking, and listening.

**Musical:** students who learn through music. They enjoy singing, listening to music, and playing musical instruments. They respond to music, group music, and rhythm.

**Interpersonal:** students who learn best in a group. They work cooperatively and have a sense of empathy for the feelings and experiences of others. They enjoy games, brainstorming, and problem solving with the group.
