Dear Presbytery Colleagues,

A wondrous and glorious season is settling upon us as we prepare for our December 4 gathering of our Presbyterian faith community at Parkwood United Presbyterian Church. Our congregations and homes will be alive with praise and thanks for God's abundance in which we share. In fact, I think setting time apart in a time of national anxiety about the economy, the presidential transition, and heightened international tensions is an effective "anti-anxiety" measure. Many of the Psalms are set in a time of fear and anxiety. Psalm 46 reminds us that *God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult.* Turbulent times challenge us but also "gift" us with the stark reminder of our finite nature, our need for a divine savior, a source for "being" beyond ourselves. My Thanksgiving will be rich in celebration and trust that yours will also.

We also prepare for our Presbytery gathering on December 4 at Parkwood United Presbyterian as we approach the liturgical season of Advent. This is one of my favorite times of the year. It is a time to watch, wait, pray, and expect. This is a season to keep alert to the signs of the presence of the resurrected Jesus. I believe that Jesus is walking through our churches and homes reminding us to that there is only one savior. We trust in might, Wall Street, Presidents, armies, Presbytery leaders, pastors, and politicians to save us. We trust in them because that is our daily experience, it is practical to do so, and "realistic." I remember the first time I realized that my father was not infallible. He made a misjudgment while we were boating and fishing in Egg Harbor, NJ. His ingenuity got us out of dangerous situation, but I remember the shock of this new awareness my dad was fallible and finite. Advent is our opportunity to "watch and pray" as we await the new future the Spirit will usher in among us as Pittsburgh Presbytery.

Our journey of transition will be full of bumps in the road and pot holes here and there. The journey is bumpy while we learn to let go of ways of doing and being that no longer work. New ways of doing and being are unsettling, uncomfortable, and disorienting. These processes, however, are the hand of the Spirit at work shaping and forming a people fit for a new time.

I believe that God desires Pittsburgh Presbytery to be a faith community who will help lead our entire Presbyterian Church (USA) into a new era of vibrant ministry. This will mean radical, soul searching openness to the call of God among us. I invite you to join me to begin Advent with open hearts that can be shaped by God, ears that are open to the voice of the Spirit who calls us, and feet that are energized to walk in the foot steps of Jesus who is always walking before us, beside us, behind us, over and under us.

I commend the presbytery for your patience as we look for Jesus to show up in our midst and for our eyes to be opened so that we recognize him.

Guidelines for Presbyterians During Times of Disagreement

In a spirit of trust and love, we promise we will . . .

Give them a hearing ... listen before we answer.
John 7:51 and Proverbs 18:13

1. Treat each other respectfully so as to build trust, believing that we all desire to be faithful to Jesus the Christ:
 - we will keep our conversations and communications open for candid and forthright exchange,
 - we will not ask questions or make statements in a way which will intimidate or judge others.
2. Learn about various positions on a topic of disagreement.
3. State what we think we heard and ask for clarification before responding, in an effort to be sure we understand each other.

Speak the truth in love.
Ephesians 4:15

4. Study the Bible together to better understand what God's Word says to us in our disagreement.
5. Share our concerns directly with individuals or groups with whom we have disagreements in a spirit of love and respect in keeping with Jesus' teaching.
6. Focus on ideas and suggestions instead of questioning people's motives, intelligence or integrity;
 - we will not engage in name-calling or labeling of others prior to, during, or following the discussion.
7. Share our personal experiences about the subject of disagreement so that others may fully understand our concerns.

Maintain the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace.
Ephesians 4:3

8. Indicate where we agree with those of other viewpoints as well as where we disagree.
9. Seek to stay in community with each other though the discussion may be vigorous and full of tension;
 - we will be ready to forgive and be forgiven.
10. Follow these additional Guidelines when we meet in decision-making bodies:
 - urge persons of various points to speak and promise to listen to these positions seriously;
 - seek conclusions informed by our points of agreements;
 - be sensitive to the feelings and concerns of those who do not agree with the majority and respect their rights of conscience;
 - abide by the decision of the majority, and if we disagree with it and wish to change it, work for that change in ways which are consistent with the Guidelines.
11. Include our disagreements in our prayers, not praying for the triumph of our viewpoints, but seeking God's grace to listen attentively, to speak clearly, and to remain open to the vision God holds for us all.

**REPORT OF COUNCIL
To the Meeting of Presbytery December 4, 2008**

Pittsburgh Presbytery Council met in a regular meeting on Tuesday, November 18, 2008 at the Presbytery Center. The meeting was opened with joys, concerns and prayer led by the Chair, Elder Carol Hunley. A quorum was present.

Items for Information

1. Holy Cow! Consulting

Council approved retaining Holy Cow! Consulting for assistance in the development of a *Transition Plan* that will build upon the consultant's previous Listening Process which was conducted within the Presbytery.

2. Council Retreat

Council scheduled a retreat for members of Council for January 25-26, 2009 at Crestfield Camp and Conference Center.

3. Council Chair for Calendar Year 2009

Council elected the Rev. Hendrik J.H. (Henk) Bossers (Cheswick) Chair of Council for calendar year 2009. Consideration continues for a Vice Chair for next year.

4. Chair of Finance Committee for Calendar Year 2009

Council approved Rev. Douglas Dorsey (Mt. Nebo) chair of the Finance Committee for calendar year 2009, continuing his service in such position for a second year.

5. *Per Capita* Forgiveness, Universal United Presbyterian Church

Council approved Universal United Presbyterian Church be forgiven *per capita* in the amount of \$7,011.31, the congregation having agreed that it will pay \$100 per month for 36 months towards the remaining past due per capita balance and all future assessed amounts on a quarterly basis

6. Lazarus Fund Solicitation and Offerings

Council approved the Lazarus Fund offering fund-raising Christmas cards for sale at the December 4, 2008 meeting of Presbytery, and making a mailing solicitation for such sales to Presbyterian Women and the congregations of the Presbytery.

7. Continuation for 2009 in Synod of the Trinity Networks

Council approved the Presbytery's continuation for calendar year 2009 in the following Synod of the Trinity Networks: Peacemaking Network; 2009 Trinity Youth Conference; Resource Center Network; and the Network of Presbyterian Men.

8. The Great Commission Ministry Team Established

Council approved the creation of a Great Commission Ministry Team to assist congregations and individuals in their efforts to coordinate local, national and international mission initiatives.

**September 2008 Summary Financial Statement
Treasurer Notes and Comments on Variances**

General Notes

Note 1. This statement is a summary of only the operating budget funds of Pittsburgh Presbytery. It does not include any proceeds from the settlements with Beverly Heights U. P. Church or Memorial Park Presbyterian Church.

Revenue Notes

Note 2. The Per Capita Income budget for 2008 is \$60,000 less than last year, and both membership and the per capita rate have decreased; so a drop in income is to be expected.

Note 3. Directed Pledges from Congregations consists of \$162,232 passed directly to Mission Agencies, \$47,497 passed directly to congregations and \$3,950 remaining to fund the budget. (See notes 7 & 8)

Note 4. The budget for Use of Reserve Funds is down \$102,000 as compared to last year.

Note 5. Removing Directed Pledges from Congregations and use of Reserve Funds, actual income for 2008 is \$1,737,150 and \$1,729,733 for 2007. Therefore income is actually up \$7,417 compared to last year.

Expense Notes

Note 6. Crestfield personnel costs are up \$27,613 compared to 2007. However, the Program and Maintenance Director positions were not fully staffed until August of 2007. Other notable areas of increase are in Food (\$8,818) and Daycamp (\$9,193), both of which are due to an increase of participation.

Note 7. The 2008 Enhancement Grant expenses of \$119,574 consist of \$72,077 budgeted support and \$47,497 in designated giving from congregations.

Note 8. The 2008 Mission Agencies expenses of \$321,732 consist of \$159,500 in budgeted support of validated mission agencies and \$162,232 in support of validated mission agencies directly from congregations.

Note 9. 2008 Council expense includes \$58,285 for Denominational Property and Transition costs but only \$25,373 in 2007.

Note 10. Removing Directed Giving from Congregations and use of Reserve Funds, actual expenses for 2008 are \$1,902,155 and \$1,879,849 for 2007. Therefore expenses are actually up \$22,306 as compared to last year.

This statement is a summary of activity in the general and camp funds only. These are the operating funds of Pittsburgh Presbytery.

There being a quorum present, the Commission was convened with prayer by Rev. Donald Ewing. All things being prepared in advance, decently and in order, the Commission approved the Service of installation and voted to proceed to the installation of the Rev. Amanda Richey to the direction of Presbytery and the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (USA). The Commission moved to the Sanctuary at 10:57 a.m. and installed the Rev. Amanda Richey as Associate Pastor. Rev. Donald Ewing asked the constitutional questions (Forms of Government, Chapter XIV, Section 4, 14.0405), which the candidate answered in the affirmative. The Sermon was delivered by Rev. James Gilchrist. Elder Linda Williams offered the prayer of installation. Elder George Krock asked the constitutional questions to the congregation, which were answered in the affirmative. (Form of Government, Chapter XIV, Section 4, 14.0510.)

The Minutes of the Commission were read and approved. Upon motion duly made, the Commission moved to adjourn at the conclusion of the Service of Installation with the pronouncement of Benediction by the Rev. Amanda Richey.

Resolved: Pittsburgh Presbytery, in the discharge of its pastoral duty as an ordaining body, is desirous of placing neither any candidate for ordination nor any examiner in a potentially equivocal moral position.

To that end, Pittsburgh Presbytery recognizes that candidates for ordination are expected to answer the following question with an affirmative answer:

[W-4.4003c] Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the Reformed faith as expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do, and will you be instructed and led by those confessions as you lead the people of God?

Further, Pittsburgh Presbytery notes that the confessions of the church declare, among many other things and for example, that:

[C-3.19] (W)e believe and confess the Scriptures of God sufficient to instruct and make perfect the man of God, so do we affirm and avow their authority to be from God, and not to depend on men or angels. We affirm, therefore, that those who say the Scriptures have no other authority save that which they have received from the Kirk are blasphemous against God and injurious to the true Kirk...

and

[C-1.2] We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end;

and

[C-6.131.1] (UPCUSA) Christian marriage is an institution ordained of God, blessed by our Lord Jesus Christ, established and sanctified for the happiness and welfare of mankind, into which spiritual and physical union one man and one woman enter,

cherishing a mutual esteem and love, bearing with each other's infirmities and weaknesses, comforting each other in trouble, providing in honesty and industry for each other and for their household, praying for each other, and living together the length of their days as heirs of the grace of life.

or

[C-6.133] (PCUS) Marriage is a union between one man and one woman, designed of God to last so long as they both shall live.

Therefore, Pittsburgh Presbytery offers the following guidance to potential candidates for ordination by Pittsburgh Presbytery: the only acceptable answer to the above referenced question is an unqualified "Yes," or "I do." An answer of "Yes, with departure," or "I do, with departure," is considered the moral equivalent of "No," or "I do not," and is unacceptable; and will bar a candidate for ordination from being ordained by Pittsburgh Presbytery.

Rationale

While Pittsburgh Presbytery appreciates the latitude offered by the General Assembly in its Authoritative Interpretation of 2008 which "requires examining bodies to give prayerful and careful consideration, on an individual, case-by-case basis, to any departure from an ordination standard in matters of belief or practice that a candidate may declare during examination," it also recognizes that the ordination question referenced above requires either a "Yes" or "No" answer. The question presumes that "the essential tenets of the Reformed faith" are in fact "expressed in the confessions of our church" and that they are "authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do."

Pittsburgh Presbytery notes that in their "prayerful and careful consideration, on an individual, case-by-case basis" of each candidate for ordination that each and every examiner has vowed "[that they will] be instructed and led by those confessions as [they] lead the people of God" Therefore, to qualify a candidate for ordination who expresses a "departure from an ordination standard in matters of belief or practice" places the examiner in danger of vacating their own ordination vow: intellectual and moral consistency with regard to their own vow taken would require the examiner to protest any departure from "the essential tenets of the Reformed faith as expressed in the confessions of our church." Furthermore, the qualification of a departure by an examiner would place him or her in a place of exercising authority over the "essential tenets of

the Reformed faith” as they would be making a determination over which of the ideas or truths expressed in the confessions of the church are “authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do,” and which are not; such authority is only vested in the General Assembly under our constitution and applicable case law.

Likewise, any “departure from an ordination standard in matters of belief or practice that a candidate may declare during examination” places the candidate in danger of telling an untruth when required to answer the ordination question. If, as has been observed, the only appropriate answers to the ordination question are “Yes” and “No,” the departing candidate may be placed in a moral quandary in which they either affirm that which they truly do not believe or practice, or answer negatively, and thus be barred from ordination. If the answer “Yes, with departure” is to be accepted as a legitimate answer to the ordination question, then the church is at risk of losing its theological stability and identity as “expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do”; the logical consequence of this answer is that there is no longer an absolute standard of theological truth, and this clearly contradicts the assertion that “the essential tenets of the Reformed faith [are] expressed in the confessions of our church [and are] authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do”

The conclusion is that the only meaningful standards for ordination are “the essential tenets of the Reformed faith as expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do” and that these standards must be objectively, conscientiously, and impartially applied to each and every candidate examination

Ordination Standards and Examinations Essentials, Reformed Faith and Polity

In 2006, the 217th General Assembly adopted an Authoritative Interpretation (AI) of G-6.0108 1 in the *Book of Order* that clarified the relative powers of the governing bodies within the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). This AI was affirmed and clarified by the General Assembly Permanent Judicial Commission (GAPJC) in February 2008 in the opinions found in three cases. 2 3 4

The 2006 General Assembly AI provides that *The Book of Confessions* and the Form of Government of the *Book of Order* set forth the scriptural and constitutional standards for ordination and installation. 5 Section 5b of the Authoritative Interpretation states “these standards are determined by the whole church, after the careful study of Scripture and theology, solely by the constitutional process of approval by the General Assembly with the approval of the presbyteries. These standards may be interpreted by the General Assembly and its Permanent Judicial Commission.” 6 (See at G-13.0103r.)

The GAPJC, in the three February 2008 cases, found the following:

1. Authoritative Interpretations may not change an ordination standard.

The GAPJC affirmed the General Assembly’s Authoritative Interpretation adopted from the report and recommendations of the Theological Task Force on Peace, Unity, and Purity of the Church, and found that “the GA Authoritative Interpretation did not (and constitutionally could not) change any ordination standard found in *The Book of Confessions* or the *Book of Order*.” 7

2. Governing bodies may not restate, augment, diminish, or define ordination standards.

The GAPJC found that attempts by other governing bodies to adopt resolutions, statements, or policies that paraphrase or restate provisions of the *Book of Order* and/or declare them as “essentials of Reformed faith and polity” are confusing and unnecessary and are in violation of the Constitution. Such declarations are obstructions to the requirement that a governing body must examine candidates for ordination (See at G-10.0102 I and G-11.0103n): “... [N]o lower governing body can constitutionally define, diminish, augment or modify standards for ordination and installation of church officers.” 8 “Governing bodies do not have the authority to restate or define these standards.” 9

3. Governing bodies may not waive the G-6.0106b ordination standard.

Specifically, the GAPJC reiterated that “[t]he examining body is best suited to make decisions about the candidate’s fitness for office and in this determination they may not permit departure from the ‘fidelity and chastity’ requirement found in G-6.0106b.” 10 In determining whether a candidate is in compliance with the constitutional standards, the examining governing body may allow a candidate to exercise their freedom of conscience with respect to interpretation of Scripture under G-6.0108 “to the extent that it is not a serious departure from the essential standards of Reformed faith and polity, does not infringe on the rights and views of others, and does not obstruct the constitutional governance of the church.” 11 An examining governing body may not allow a candidate to exercise their freedom of conscience if that “ignore[s] or waive[s] a specific standard of behavior that has been adopted by the whole church such as the ‘fidelity and chastity’ portion of G-6.0106b or any other similarly specific provision.” 12

4. A candidate’s actions must conform to the ordination standards.

“...[T]he church has required those who aspire to ordained office to conform their actions, though not necessarily their beliefs or opinions, to certain standards in those contexts in which the church has deemed conformity to be necessary or essential. G-6.0106b contains a provision where conformity is required by church officers....” 13 The responsibility for determination of failure to repent of any “practice which the confessions call sin” 14 is first placed on the candidate and then on the examining governing body to determine whether a departure is a failure to adhere to the essentials of Reformed faith and polity.

5. "The ordaining body must examine the candidate individually." **15**

The GAPJC also emphasized that each candidate must be examined individually by the examining governing body. Only in this way can the body determine whether any potential departure is a failure to adhere to the essentials of Reformed faith and polity.
