Synod Mission Project 2018-19

SYNOD OF THE TRINITY

The Synod of the Trinity PW International Mission Project for 2018-2019 is the Presbyterian Dominican Partnership. The purpose of the ongoing (27 year) mission partnership between the eastern Ohio and western Pennsylvania churches with Iglesia Evangelica Dominica is to foster medical, educational, and social assistance among the people of Savaneta de Yasica and the surrounding area of the Dominican Republic to those of both Dominican and Haitian descent. Medical needs are prosthetics, mobility equipment to improve ambulation for disabled children and adults (wheelchairs, adaptive strollers, walkers, crutches, and quad canes) and to establish funds for physician specialists (dentists, ophthalmologists, and therapists.). In addition, a social service focus on helping to fund a mission-school bus is an already established fund that will allow for safe transportation for children, elderly and disabled who are unable to attend school and church activities.

Checks for the Synod Mission Project should be made out to PWPP, marked Synod Mission in the memo line, and mailed to the PWPP Mission Treasurer, Pam Backstrom, 349 Fruitwood Drive, Pittsburgh, PA 15102. Pam will forward the PWPP contributions to the Synod PW treasurer. Please make your donations before June 30, 2019. The total Synod Mission goal is \$20,000.

Presbyterian Women in the Presbyteries of Pittsburgh, Redstone, Upper Ohio Valley, Washington and West Virginia (the Southwest Region) will meet this summer for the triennial Regional Gathering at the Best Western Bridgeport Inn, 100 Lodgeport Road, Bridgeport, WVA, not far from Morgantown.

The cost will be \$120 per person, based on two people per room, and includes lunch and supper Sunday and breakfast Monday, plus any supplies. Single occupancy per room is \$150. The Gathering will start with lunch at 1:00 P.M. on Sunday, June 30, and conclude around noon, Monday, July 1.

The local mission project is The Shack Neighborhood House, which provides after school and summer programs for children, designed around support for the whole family. Fall Gathering Highlights

The 30th Annual Fall Gathering and Thank Offering Launch was held on Saturday, September 15, 2018, at Bidwell United Presbyterian Church. Moderator Sarah Jane Beorn opened the gathering with prayer and the lighting of the Christ Candle. Bidwell PW Moderator Barbara Simpson gave greetings and welcomed everyone to Bidwell.

The Reverend Jane Esterline, Interim Pastor at Plum Creek Presbyterian Church, led us in worship, basing her message "Persistent Grace" on selected readings from the Book of Samuel 1. Using the story of Abigail and King David as an illustration of speaking truth to power, Rev. Esterline reinforced the importance of wise and courageous women who changed the course of events throughout the Bible. It was a powerful and inspiring message for all of us Presbyterian Women to "go and do likewise." Wilberta Pickett, our faithful friend and talented musician, enriched the worship service with beautiful offertory music and postlude, as well as piano accompaniment for the hymns.

The theme for the gathering was from Mark 10:14: "Let the children come to me, do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of God."

Appropriately, the 2018-19 PWPP Mission Project was introduced by Eileen Sharbaugh, who has spent most of her professional and volunteer career as an early childhood educator and advocate and is a co-founder of Jeremiah's Place, Pittsburgh's first and only crisis nursery. A display of knit Jere Bears, No-Sew blankets and selected books was provided by PWPP Vice Moderator Carol MacDonald. Written instructions were provided to take back to the congregational PW groups. The mission project, "Bears, Blankets, Books and Bucks" allows opportunities for hands-on as well as financial support for Jeremiah's Place.

The motion was made and approved to pledge \$6,000 for local missions and \$12,000 for National and International Missions for the year 2019. The morning program was closed with prayer by Rev. Esterline. A delicious lunch, provided by our gracious PW sisters in Christ at Bidwell, was enjoyed by all.

Together in Action for Education

Mary Alice Lightle, Vice Moderator for Issues, PW in Pittsburgh Presbytery

Presbyterian Women Churchwide made children's education a focus for the 2015–2018 triennium. PW has partnered with the PC(USA) in its Educate a Child initiative, to strengthen quality education for a million children in the United States and around the world by 2020.

Supporting education for all children will improve lives in untold ways. Lack of education has many adverse consequences for individuals and society:

In America, 1 in 4 children grow up without learning to read.

30 million American adults read below basic level.

33% of high school graduates will never read a book after high school.

50% of U.S. adults can't read an 8th grade book.

2/3 of students who cannot read proficiently by the end of 4th grade will end up in jail or on welfare.

46% of adults can't read the labels on their prescriptions.

Low literacy directly costs the healthcare industry \$70 million each year.

May 5 through May 11 have been designated by Presbyterian Women as "Together in Action Days for Education."

Consider these ideas for your PW group's work to support education and literacy programs in your area:

- · Community book sale—sell used books at low cost for families with limited budgets.
- · Community Story Hour—host it at your church and read aloud to children of the community.
- · Book drive—donate books to hospitals, schools, community centers and more.
