

From The Liberty Bridge & Tunnel, follow Route 19/West Liberty Ave./Washington Road through Dormont, Mt. Lebanon, past the Galleria. Turn left at the third traffic light onto Ft. Couch Road. Proceed in left lane, past So. Hills Village, past McDonald's. Make a left turn at the traffic light onto Bethel Church Rd. Bethel Presbyterian Church is at the top of the hill, pass church and turn right into parking lot.

From Fort Pitt Bridge & Tunnel, take the Banksville exit and stay on Banksville Road past the Dormont Pool. Turn right onto Beverly Road and follow to Cochran Road. Turn left onto Cochran and follow past Mt. Lebanon High School to Washington Road/Route 19 turn right, pass the Galleria. Turn left at the third traffic light onto Ft. Couch Road. Proceed in left lane, past So. Hills Village, past McDonald's. Make a left turn at the traffic light onto Bethel Church Rd. Bethel Presbyterian Church is at the top of the hill, pass church and turn right into parking lot.

The Birthday Offering was collected up and dedicated, and Moderator Sarah Jane Beorn announced the final results of the mission project for Jeremiah's Place, which also included a check for \$1,980, enough to cover the cost for one 24-hour period, and \$545 in gift cards.

Six of us from Pittsburgh Presbytery, representing Bidwell, East Liberty, Northmont, Oakdale and Third, reunited with our sisters in faith from West Virginia, Redstone, and Upper Ohio Valley to share stories of mutual trials and accomplishments over the past year.

Susan Nesti guided us in a time of reflection and prayer as the sounds of ocean waves washed over us. Presbyterian Women's Substance Use Disorder Initiative

Deaths from heroin and prescription opioids have increased significantly in recent years. In Allegheny County, the number of opiate-related overdose deaths has more than doubled since 2014, with more than 640 deaths last year. There are now more drug overdose deaths than car accident deaths in Pennsylvania. Substance abuse affects one in every four families here.



Beginning with the 2018–2021 triennium, PW groups may focus their justice work around substance use disorder (SUD). Learn about the ways you and your PW group or church can advocate for SUD prevention programs, safe drug disposal, just legislation regarding drugs and the ways to support individuals in your group or congregation struggling with substance use disorder,

The mission of Knitted Knockers is to connect volunteer knitters and crocheters with breast cancer survivors to offer free Knitted Knockers to any woman who wants them. There is a huge demand for Knitted Knockers that can't be met by any one group, but together we can do it!
