Strategy:

- Partner well with families - students cannot be separated with from their families. Emphasize communication, care of and for parents, and parental involvement.
- Create an environment that is safe, welcoming, and engaging.
- Provide opportunities for leadership development
- Emphasize belonging over believing
- Form adult leaders who live like Jesus and love like Jesus.
- Teach students how to think, rather than just what to think. Create an environment in which hard questions are encouraged.
